**AGREEMENT FOR COLLECTION, TRANSPORTATION, TREATMENT
AND DISPOSAL OF BIO MEDICAL WASTE.**

THIS AGREEMENT is executed on this ____ day of ____ 2026 at Nagpur.

BETWEEN

M/s. SUPERB HYGIENIC DISPOSALS, Nagpur.

Through Mr. Rabi S. Singh aged about 47 yrs.,

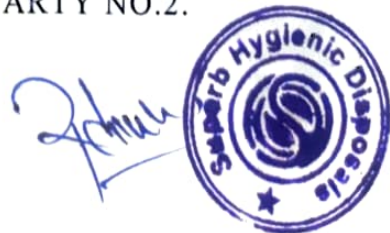

R/O Nagpur. Hereinafter called as service provider (PARTY NO.1)

AND

**The Dean, Indira Gandhi Government Medical College and
General Hospital, Nagpur.**

Hereinafter called waste generator PARTY NO.2.



That the service provider / Party No. 1 is having a Bio Medical waste disposal unit at **Kh.No.133, Mouja, Bhandewadi, Nagpur.** Which is in association with Nagpur Municipal Corporation.

That the waste generator / Party No. 2 is having its Hospital in the Name and style of Indira Gandhi Government Medical College and General Hospital, C.A. Road, Nagpur. In the said Hospital, Waste generator is having **594 beds** of indoor patient and in-house services generated a Bio-Medical Waste.

On the request of Party No. 2, Party No.1 has agreed to undertake the work of collection, transportation and disposal Bio Medical Waste generated in the Hospital/ Clinic/Laboratories of Party No. 2 according to rules Laid by MPCB. The said agency should complete all formal requirements like seek authorization for collection, transportation, storage & disposal of Bio-Medical Waste from MPCB & should abide by the rules & regulations Laid by CPCB/MPCB from time to time on the following terms and condition.

1 **Waste** generator hereby declares that in his Hospital, he is having **594 beds** for indoor patient and in house services like **1) Pathology Lab. + Blood Bank, 2) X-ray unit and OPD 3)Gyniec/Ostrectis & allied 4)Surgery & allied 5)Medicine & allied 6) Forensic Medicine & Anotomy7) Pediatric + A R T. 8) Immunization & All Injection Clinic.**

2) **Service** provider / Party No. 1 has accepted the work of collection, transportation and disposal of entire Bio Medical Waste of the waste generator.

3) **The** waste generator will arrange itself non-chlorinated coloured plastic bags approved by pollution control board for stocking and packing of Bio-medical waste.

4) **The** Waste generator will arrange collection and proper segregation of entire Bio-medical waste i.e. **Category No.1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,10** including **Plastic Material** generated in its various departments and wards as per the guidelines of the Bio-medical waste management and disposal rules 1998, and its segregation as per details annexed. Party No. 2 shall keep the material ready at the collection end point and Party No.1 has agreed to collect the Bio-Medical waste during 9 am to 6 pm or any other time, which may be mutually agreed upon. Party No.2 should provide **BMW Store Room** at end point with their own cost.



5) The waste generator will pack the segregated Bio-medical waste as per rules at the collection end point in Colour coded bags label the said bags as per schedule IV (rule 6) of the Bio-medical waste (management and handling) rules 1998 and amended 2003 as per section 6, 8 and 25 of Environment (Protection) Act 1986. It is the responsibility of the Party No. 1 to collect, Transport and dispose of the Bio-medical waste.

6) The waste generator undertakes to deliver to the service provider only the segregated Bio-medical waste generated on daily basis, general waste i.e. *(municipal solid waste) is not to be put into the service provider's bags at all* for any violation of the Bio-medical rules in this regard the waste generator shall be exclusively responsible.

7) That the waste generator agreed that they would pay service provider disposal charges, as per Annex-I.

8) The Party No.1 should raised **Two** separate monthly bills in the name of Dean, Indira Gandhi Govt. Medical College and General Hospital and Party No.2 should pay bill on monthly basis.

9) No change or modification or waiver of any of the terms of this agreement shall be effective unless agreed to in writing and signed by duly authorized officer of each of the parties hereto.

10) Party No. 1 the service provider and Waste generator agreed that this agreement is valid from **01/07/2026 to 30/06/2027**. And after the expiry of the said period of this agreement, the parties will renew the agreement on fresh terms and conditions as would be mutually agreed upon.

11) All disputes and questions in connection with this deed arising between parties shall be referred to the arbitration of the two arbitrator one to be appointed by each party and in case of their disagreement to an umpire appointed by the said arbitrator or in case of their default by the parties.

12) In the event there is any objection and / or notice for breach of the rules regarding transportation treatment and disposal of bio-medical waste, Party No. 1 shall be solely responsible in that behalf.



13) All the expenses with regard to stamp duty and registration charges if required and all legal expenses in respect of the preparation of the contract shall be exclusively borne and paid by the Party No.1 i.e. contractor.

14) The safety & Security of the staff & workers involved in the work as per agreement is the whole responsibility of Party No.1 and Party No.1 will be sole responsible for any damages or losses occurring during the process of work as per agreement & will have to arrange for any compensation in case of any unforeseen event.

15) In the event the Party No. 1 commits any default in the service the Party No. 2 shall be at liberty to discontinue this agreement with prior written notice of one month.

16) This agreement is executed in Triplicate; one original singed copy will remain with Party No. 2.

 - 4) As per **Revised Guidelines for CBMWTF, 2016**, rates will be revised every year as per CPI/WPI Index.
 - 5) **Waste generator** as well is required to maintain weight records for billing purposes.
